On behalf of the Australian Association of Gerontology (AAG), I have great pleasure in inviting you to participate in this year's National Conference. The Conference will be held in Melbourne, Victoria, from 17 - 19 November 2004.

The AAG is a multi-disciplinary association of professionals involved in the area of gerontology and the Conference is its annual event aimed at furthering the mission of the AAG which is "to expand knowledge on ageing", through the presentation and discussion of new research.

The theme of the 2004 conference is *Maturing Assets: Appreciating an ageing Australia* and we seek papers that reflect this theme. Two of our keynote speakers will be Prof Ladislav Volicer from Boston University, USA, whose expertise is in palliative care programs for people with dementia and Prof Louise Rolland whose address will be around the theme of mature workers and retirement planning. In addition we expect papers from a broad range of speakers from practice, policy, research and education. The theme provides an opportunity for presenters to expand knowledge in relation to how an ageing population can be an asset as well as how we might ensure older individuals can be assisted to maximise their assets, be they physical, social, financial, spiritual, psychological or other.

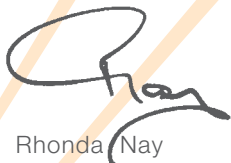
The conference format will follow the successful Hobart conference with a mix of:
