

# MindMatters Plus GP Initiative

The MindMatters Plus General Practice Initiative (MM+ GP) is a demonstration involving 17 Divisions of General Practice across Australia. The initiative aims to bring schools and the primary health care sector together to develop better referral pathways and networks of care for secondary students with high support needs in the area of mental health and well-being.

The initiative is a collaboration between ADGP's Mental Health Program and the National Divisions Youth Alliance.

The MindMatters Plus General Practice Initiative is an extension of the secondary school based initiatives, MindMatters and MindMatters Plus.

The Commonwealth Department of Health and Ageing has funded the initiative under the National Mental Health Strategy and the National Suicide Prevention Strategy (as it does MindMatters and MindMatters Plus). The initiative is funded until December 2005.

## **MindMatters and MindMatters Plus**

MindMatters is the Commonwealth Department of Health and Ageing's national resource for promoting wellbeing for all Australian schools with secondary enrolments. It is being managed by the Australian Principals Associations Professional Development Council (APAPDC) and Curriculum Corporation.

MindMatters Plus is a national demonstration initiative that aims to develop a good practice approach to improving the capacity of secondary schools to support students with high needs in the area of mental health and wellbeing. It builds on the existing MindMatters project.

The 17 demonstration schools within MindMatters Plus make up a very diverse group of school communities, ranging in size from 50 students to 1,800, located in capital cities, regional towns and rural areas and with diverse populations. Many schools are well advanced with mental health promotion and prevention projects designed to strengthen life skills, resilience and wellbeing among students, particularly those at risk.

MindMatters Plus is managed APAPDC and the Australian Guidance and Counselling Association (AGCA). Both organisations are key partners of ADGP in the implementation of MM+ GP.

## **MindMatters Plus GP Initiative**

The initiative seeks to increase the capacity of demonstration schools, together with their local community, to provide support for students with high mental health needs within primary care settings. It will also identify priorities for future national action in terms of enhancing the school, community and primary care interface.

The initiative encourages and assists Divisions with a *MindMatters Plus* school in their catchment (see overleaf for list) to work jointly with the school to develop a plan to improve access to primary mental health care by young people with high support needs. This support includes access to a capacity fund for those Divisions and the development of a resource kit for use across Divisions, schools, GPs and other primary health care professionals.

The ongoing work being done across many Divisions of General Practice, in terms of youth mental health programs in schools, including other collaborative work with schools is recognised.

Some MindMatters Plus schools have already established links with general practice and most are now working with their local Division to implement a general practice component to their demonstration.

**MindMatters Plus GP cont'd.**

Given the connection with ongoing work in several Divisions, MM+ GP has the potential to be of value across the Divisional network, not just for those Divisions associated with the MindMatters Plus demonstration schools.

The MM+ GP initiative is very much about laying the foundations for implementing sustainable referral pathways and takes a staged approach to building relationships between Divisions and schools.

Encouraging partnerships to develop under the initiative, is a step along the way to establishing and refining effective referral pathways and networks of care for students with high support needs in the area of mental health and well-being.

ADGP will continue to communicate progress under the initiative through relevant e-newsletters and e-bulletins such as ADGP News and the Primary Mental Health Care Bulletin.
